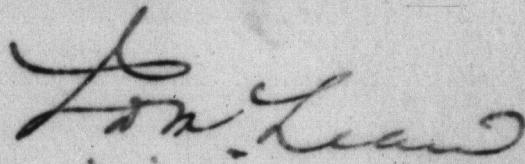
Ottawa, December 22, 1908.

Gentlemen,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 2nd instant, in regard to issue of patent for right of way and station grounds of the Canadian Northern Railway on Moosomin and Thunderchild Indian Reserves, and in connection therewith beg to say that, in a letter addressed Messrs. McKenzie & Mann on the 18th of August, 1904, it was stated that the Department would insist on the right of way being properly fenced on both sides and that the usual necessary crossings be provided, two of which, one on each reserve, should be under-crossings, suitable for cattle.

Upon your furnishing satisfactory evidence of compliance with these requirements, the question of issue of patent will receive prompt attention.
