Dear Mr. *AWREY*

On the occasion of your visit to this Post in last summer you left with me the Treaty Ticket which I enclose herewith, for the purpose of finding out the whereabouts of this man Michael Koostachin.

I have found that the youth known as Michael Koostachin is at Lake River Outpost, and that he is an orphan, and resides with Jacob Shagamagashish, so that the name on this Treaty Ticket should read, "Wenasan Koostachin", who resides at Weenusk Post, and who is the son of the present wife of Charles Kayshooke Junior, of Attawapiskat, she having been twice married.

I trust that this information, as I have been able to furnish you with, will prove of service to you.

Everything at Attawapiskat is going on as usual, the natives are well off this winter since furs are a little more plentiful, and rabbits and Grouse are numerous.

As in other parts, we have experienced much cold weather this winter with the first thaw but a few days ago, and, now another cold spell has set in.

I trust you are enjoying good health, and, needless to say, we are looking forward to your being with us again this summer, when we shall be very pleased to offer yourself and your party all accommodation and assistance in every possible way,
