The accused whom I now recognize, and who was in my Platoon, was told several times to keep up with his section. The last time I told him to keep up with his section, he said that on account of the enemy shelling he could not move forward, or something to that effect. I few minutes later, I noticed that he was missing without permission. He reported himself to me at 1500 hrs on the 17th of October 1945."

I few minutes afterwards, my pergeant told me that the accused was missing. He had no permission what-sever to leave the Flatoon. He reported himself back at 1300 hrs on the 17th of October 1945. seever to leave the Platoon. He repo

report to me afterwards."
