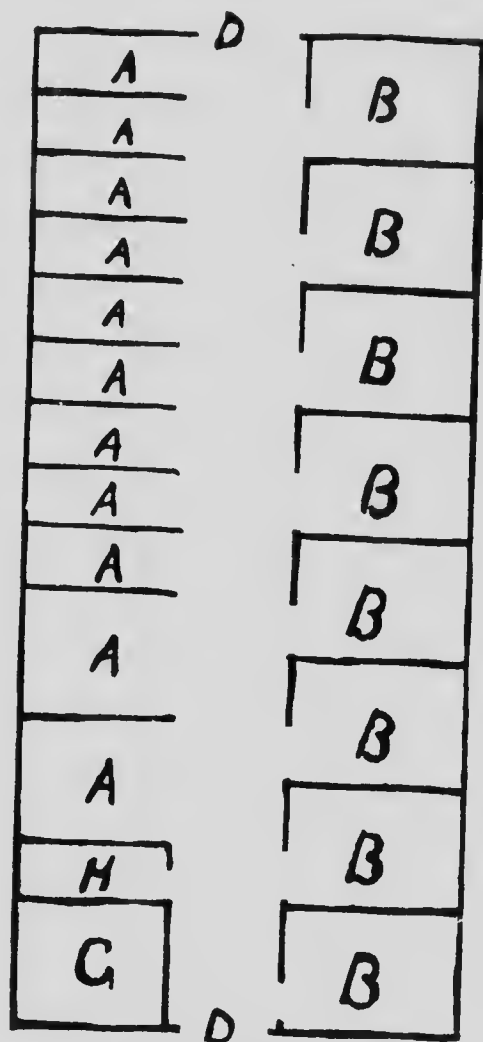


Figure 95.—Ground floor plan of a barn for brood mares. A—open stalls; B—box stalls; C—grain; H—tools.
