## CONDITIONS FOR THE DISTRICT PLOUGHING MATCHES.

- 1. Any Candidate shall be disqualified, whose sod is settled, by any other, means, except the Plough, or the foot of the Plough-Man, as the Plough-works, or who suffers any sssistance, setting of irons, or otherwise, to be given to the Plough-man. 2. Any person having obtained first premiums.
- at any former Distric' Ploughing match shall be disqualified; but such persons may compete in a separate class, for honorary or other reward.

3. The premiums shall be awarded to the Candidates who shall perform the work in the shortest space of time, and in the best manner.

IP N. B .- The Judges appointed as for the Cattle Shows.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR GRAIN & GREEN CROPS, &C. &C.

- 1. Any claimants for premiums on Grain or Green crops, whose farm generally does not appear to the judge to be well managed, in proportion to the time they may have been in possession of it shall be disqualified. 2. That premiums offered for Wheat shall only
- be adjudged where the wheathas been row-ed after green crop or summer fallow. This rule however, not to be enforced before the next year.

PREMIUMS OFFERED TO CANADIAN PRACTIC-AL FARMERS ONLY, IN THE COUNTY

OF MONTREAL.

- 1. Three premiums offered to Canadian Practical Farmers, for well managed Farms generally. The Judges to inspect the Tillage, Drains. Fences, Stock and Barns of each competitor, and report accordingly.
- 2. Three premiums offered to Canadian Practical Farmers, for the greatest quantity of summer Fallow. The Judges shall be par-ticular, that it is well Ploughed, and clean from all kinds of grass and weeds.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO THE JUDGES AT THE CAT-TLE SHOWS, &c. &c.

You are to decide which is the best Animal, or lot of Animals in each class, having regard in forming yourjudgment to excellence and utility of form, quantity of flesh, lightness of offal, propensity to milk or fatten, and early maturity; also, in Sheep, to quantity and quality of wool. Having signed your adjudication, you are not to mention your decision until announced to the Committee, you are not to disclose the opinions of each other, previous not to unscious the optimizer of each other, previous to your report, and the decision of the majority shalt be conclusive, you shall withhold any premium when there shall not appear to be sufficient merit in the Animal or its offspring, you shall number the lots in each class, in the order of the comparative merit. merit.

IT N. B.-When Judges are appointed to the inspection of other than live stock the instructions to be altered so as to be applicable to that particu-lar inspection; according to the general conditions of the Society. by which the Judges are to be governed in their adjudications.
