

other brother as may be appointed by the Grand Lodge or Grand Master to receive the same,) the Charter, books, papers, furniture and funds of the Lodge.

ARTICLE V.—FUNDS.

SECTION I.—CONTRIBUTIONS.

1. There shall be two regular funds of this Lodge, to be known respectively as the Widows and Orphans' Fund and the General Benefit Fund; and the Lodge may provide by its By-laws for the institution of a Special Fund or Funds for any of the benevolent purposes contemplated by the Order: Provided always, that, in the case of every such Special Fund, the receipts and disbursements on account thereof shall be kept altogether distinct from the regular funds hereby established.

2. The Entrance Fee of this Lodge must be paid in every case previous to the admission of the candidate, and shall not be less than ~~one pound five shillings~~ *\$5.00*.

11.00 The charges for Degrees shall not be at a less rate than ~~five shillings~~ for each of the five Degrees, and all monies received on account of Degree Charges shall be applied to the General Benefit Fund.

4. The contributions of each member to the Regular Benefit Fund of this Lodge shall be determined by the By-laws, but shall not be at a less rate than ~~seven shillings and six pence per quarter~~ *\$1.50*; one-third of whatever may be the quarterly contribution to the Benefit Funds shall be placed to the credit of the Widows and Orphans' Fund, and the remaining two-thirds to the credit of the General Benefit Fund.

5. The Lodge shall have the power of enacting such fees for Visiting and Clearance Cards (to be applied to the General Fund), and such fines for neglect of duty, &c. (to be applied to the Widows and Orphans' Fund), as may be determined by the By-laws.

SECTION II.—DISBURSEMENTS.
