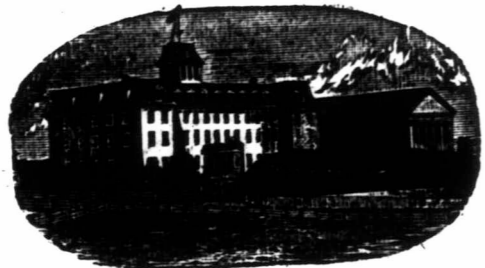
DIED
