The Education sholen for your Royal Highness and your very eminent professional Merit afford to His Majesty's loyal Subjects the most pleasing Satisfaction; not only as evincing His Majesty's continued attention and Regard to the Welfare of His People, but as adding further additional Security to the Empire, and the delightful Presage of suture Glory and encreased Renown to the illustrious House of Hanover.

"That our Most Gracious Sovereign and His Royal Confort may long continue happily to reign in the Hearts of all their Subjects, and that your Royal Highness may be distinguished as the most celebrated of your Profession are the ardent and united Wishes of the People of Nova-Scotia.
