WAS TAKEN WITH CRAMPS

Harry Austin Loses His Life While Bathing Near The City

WAS A GOOD SWIMMER

News was received in the city this afternoon of the drowning of a young lad, named Harry Austin, at a point half a mile up the river. The accident took place at the rear of the farm owned by Geo. Lamphard. Austin was a young man 19 years of age, and until lately he worked in a roller mill in London. He came here yesterday with the intention of working for Mr. Lamphard. He had just gone out to the farm this morning, and after dinner he and the boy who is there, Dave Kelly, thought they would go in for a swim.

At this point the water is about 25 feet deep, and the two swam out to the middle of the river, and Austin made for the opposite shore. Both were good swimmers. Kelly, turning around, noticed that his companion was not in sight. Thinking that he had merely dived down in the water he did not bother much about it. He became uneasy, however, when young Austin did not come up, and he raised an alarm.

The unfortunate young man had evidently taken a cramp and gone down without having a chance to cry for assistance. He was within 15 feet of the opposite bank when last seen.

About ten minutes after the accident some men came along in a scow belonging to The Hadley Company. The water was so deep, however, that they were unable to do anything, and they had to come on to the city. All they had with them was a 14 foot pole, and it was too short to reach to the bottom.

At three o'clock this afternoon, the body had not been found. Three men are at work, and it is hoped that the body will be found before night. Will Janke was notified and left for the scene of the drowning.

Miss Lucas, who lives next door with her mother, also has a little colored baby that is said to be quite dark in complexion, although its mother cannot see traces of darkness in her child to any marked degree. These two facts put together with the additional fact that the two young mothers are very jealous, are the cause of considerable trouble in that neighborhood.

Miss Morton, the mother of the little colored pickney, was a visitor at the Police Court this morning, and laid complaint with the authorities. According to the Morton story, Miss Lucas claims that her baby is much lighter than the Morton one, and she is on the verge of a "scrap," but Miss Morton does not want to scrap with her.

Miss Morton's baby is provided with little toys and chairs, and the Lucas baby comes over and takes the toys away. Miss Lucas encourages her baby to do this, and gives the Morton woman every chance to make a quarrel.

"I don't want to fuss with her," said Miss Morton this morning, "and all I want to do is to live in peace. I am satisfied that my baby is lighter than the other one, and I am willing to let the matter go at that. What's the use having a row over it?"
