## House of Refuge:

We are pleased to notice that the County Council of Huron, at a late meeting, has agreed that it is mest desirable that they should have a House of Refuge for their County. They find, upon enquiry, that the amount which has been expended within the last three years in suppert of the poor and destitate, is not only very large, but that those upon whom it was spent were very poorly provided for. We think the poorly provided for. We think the County Council of Huron have taken a step in the right direction, and we hope to see other Counties follow their example in this respect. We trust also, that they will urge upon their member in the Local House to use his best endeavours Local House to use his best endeavours to induce the Government to introduce a clause into the Municipal law, making it compulsory for County Councils to provide some place of refuge for those who are entirely destitute, so that the Counties which have already Poor Houses may not be flooded, as they have been, by poor from Counties who refuse to find a refuge for their really destitute poor. If a compulsory law be considered to arbitrary, an Act might be passed enabling the counties that have erected Houses of Refuge to collect a erected Houses of Refuge to collect a reasonable amount as payment for the support and protection they may have

support and protection they may have given to the poor of other counties. An Act, such as this would commend itself to every member of Parliament, as not only fair, but just in principle.

The County of Waterloo has erected and maintained a House of Refuge at considerable expense, and notwithstanding all the effort of those connected with its management, the poor of other municipalities are forced upon them for protection. For instance, a destitute person at this season of the year, finds that no refuge will be given him in his own County, very naturally makes every effort to find his way to the House of Refuge in this County, and in view of the inclement season and the destitute circumstances of the applicant, the authorized of the county of the supplicant, the authorized county is the supplicant to the supplicant is the supplicant to the supplicant is the cumstances of the applicant, the authorities of our Poor House are obliged to give him shelter for a time. It is to be protected from such a grievance as this that we ask the Legislature to inthis that we ask the Legislature to interfere and make it imperative that each County shall protect and provide for its own poor, and in asking this, no one can say that we are making an unreasonable demand.—Berlin Telegraph.

## Hard and Soft Water.

All housewives may not know he materially the effects of hard and soft water differ in the cooking of various vegetables. While one species of vegetable requires hard or soft water, as the ease may be, another species becomes sensibly deterierated by it. For in-stance, peas and beans cooked in hard water, containing lime or gypsum, will not boil tender, because these subnot boil tender, because these sub-stances harden vegetable caseine. In soft water they boil tender, and lose a certain raw, rank taste, which they re-tain in hard starr. Many vegetables (as onions) boil searly tasteless in soft water, because all the flavor is dissolved. The addition of salt often checks this, as in the case of coipons, causing the vege-The addition of salt often checks this, as in the ease of onions, causing the vegetables to retain their peculiar flavoring principles, besides much nutritious matter, which might be lost in soft water. Thus it appears the salt hardens the water to a degree. For extracting juices of meat, to make a broth or soup, soft water, unsalted and cold at first, is best, for it much more readily penetrates the tissues; but for boiling meats where the juices should be retained, hard water is preferable, and the meat should be nut in while it is boiling, so as should be put in while it is boiling, so a to seal up the pores at once.

How TO MAKE A CHEAP CELLAR How TO MAKE A CHEAP CELLAR BOTTOM.—The New tork Industrial Monthly says:—In sections of the country where there is an abundance of coble stenes, collect a few loads of them about four or five inches in diameter, grade the bottom of the cellar, lay the cobbles in rows, and ram them down one third their thickness into the ground, so that they will not rock nor be sunk below the line of the rows by any heave a unaring member to ressure, such heavy superinoumbent pressure, such as the weight of a hogshead of molasses or tierce of vinegar. The bottom of the cellar should be graded so that the outside will be at least two inches lower cellar should be graded so that the outside will be at least two inches lower than the middle. A mistake sometimes occurs by grading the cellar bottom in such a manner that the centre will be two or three inches lower than the outside. When this is the case, should water enter from the entaide, it will flow directly toward the middle. A straight-edged board should be placed frequently on each row of stones as they are being rammed, so that the upper sides may be in a line with each other. After the stones are laid and well rammed down, place a few boards on the pavement to walk on; then make a grouting of clean and and water lime, or Rosendale cemeit, and pour it on the stones until all theinterstices are filled. As soon as the grouting has set spread a layer of good cement mortar one inch thick; over the top of the pavement, and trovel the surfice of smoothly. In order to spread the mortar true and even on the surface, lay an inch board one toot from the wall on the surface of one foot from the wall on the surface of the pavement, stand on the board and fill the space with mortar even with the top of the board; after which, more the heard one foot, fill the space with mortar and invest it off smothly. Such a floor, and will endure as, long as the superstructure is kept in repair. A floor made in the foregoing manner on the ground in the basement of a barn, a piggety or a stable, will be ret proof, and wulld be found chapper and more serviceable than a piant floor. The work should be done in the forner part of the growing season, so that the conent may have time to become dry and hard before cold
