es, having been in five days. As we were on our way to the trenches we passed another Canadian regiment going out. Thinking I might see someone I knew I kept a sharp lookout, and to my surprise I saw Mr. Herder's son—I think it was Art. He was wearing an officer's uniform, but passed too quickly for me to make out what rank he held. On saying to my chum next to me "Oh look at Herder," he turned round and gave a smile. I don't know if he knew who I was. He looked fine and was wearing his usual grin when he passed me. It's good to see one of your own out this way."

NOTE FROM A. J. HERDER.

France, June 9th. My Dear Mother,-I have just com out of the trenches, as my battalion has been taken out for a rest after wo stretches of fighting, nine days at one point and six days at another. have come off scatheless so far, and hope to do so all the time. Don't worry about me. \* \* \* \* I am conscious of only doing my simple duty to my country and to humanity in general. We have been in some of the longest and bloodiest fights of the war and have lost a good many men, The French barque Dumfrieshire, which sailed from San Francisco on January 22nd, for Dublin, with a cargo of barley, was sunk to-day by a German submarine. The crew landed of Milford Haven.
