## **Finance Minister Presents Budget.**

Slight Amendment in Tariff--Certain Wares Returned to Free List--Reduction in Salt Bulk Fish Export Duty.

(From the Daily News.)

Yesterday, at the House, Minister of Finance Brownrigg introduced the Budget and reviewed the three years, 1918-1919, 1919-1920 and 1920-1921. The total revenue for the year 1918-1919 was \$9.535.725.16 and expenditure \$6,766,430.51, showing a surplus of \$2.769.294.65. For the current year ending to-morrow, the total revenue is expected to exceed the Estimates for which returns are available, or to the end of March, the total revenue was \$6,881,555,89 and for the remaining 3 months is estimated to be \$4,-500,000.00. The Budget then deals with the otential wealth of the timber, fishery, agricultural, coal and paper industries and states the development of the same would mean considerable ccess of revenue to the Exchequer. It also quotes authorities to the effect that there may be reduction in the cost of necessaries after another harvest, which will be followed by a reduction in wages. The whole process will be gradual and a rapid decline does not seem probable. The concensus of opinion is that there will be no downward tendency in the price of necessaries in the immediate future and it is well for the people to look forward to a continuance of present cost of necessaries of life for at least the remaining months of this year and probably the great part of next. For this reason it should be our aim and policy to augment our financial strength by multiplying our produc-




