DISALLOWANCE.

John Sandfield Macdonald has been nubbed. Perhaps he does not mind that sort of thing. At all events he was snubbed once before, and does not appear to have acquired any additional prudence in consequence.— Some of the Acts which he carried recklessly through the Legislature during the first session were disal-lowed by Sir J. A. Macdonald, never during the first session were disallowed by Sir J. A. Macdonald, nevertheless the Ontario Premier during the last session, committed his previous mistake of going beyond the bounds of his authority, and suffers the same punishment of again seeing some of his pet Acts vetoed. We might have thought that the lengthened experience of which Sandfield Macdonald is wont to boast would have been a sufficient safe-guard against his treading on forbidden ground, but if we do not lay ignorance to his charge, we cannot help accusing him of possessing an overweening arrogance which makes him sometimes very disagreeable and sometimes very ridiculous. It is in the latter light he appears at present, when the Minister of Justice has vetoed three Bills, on the passage of which the Premier plumed himself. These are, the Privileges of Parliament Act, the County Courts Act, and an Act respecting increased Salary to the Judges. While the first mentioned Bill was under discussion a prominent member of the House pointed out in a clear and incontestable argument the unconstitutional nature of the measure, and showed that the House in passing such a law was exceeding its authority.—

The Premier, who never halts for lack of confidence in himself, said he was allowed to do so, with the result noted above.

The County Courts Act was intended to repeal certain provisions of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada and change the tenure by which the Judges of these Courts hold office. It provided that they should hold office during pleasure—whether their own pleasure or John Sandfield's is not stated, and is now immaterial—and should be subject to removal by the Lieut. Governor for inability, or misbehaviour, if the charge were established to the satisfaction of the Lieut. Governor in Council. The objectionable feature of this Act is that the Ontario Legislature arrogates the power to dismiss Judges who are appointed and paid by the Pominion Government, or simply, John Sandfield has undertaken a work of super-progation, and received no thanks for his officiousness. The Minister of Justice is endeavouring to keep him in his place, and wisely guarding the independence of the Bench. Whether any more Bills than the three mentioned have been disallowed is not yet known, but those should be sufficient to teach the Premier a little wisdom, and convince him of the necessity of paying more heed to the admonition of men who understand constitutional law better than he does. Six hundred arrests are the consequence of the disturbance. The opposition is evidently growing stronger day by day, the returns showing 199 official and 93 opposition candidates elected. Napoleon may reign as did most of the emperors of ancient Rome so long as the army remains faithful, but the present situation appears fraught with danger, not to his dynasty alone, but to himself. The slumbering spirit of republicanism seems to be awakening in the minds of Frenchmen, and should the sentiment pervade the army then exit speedily the son of Hortense, for it is not to be expected that Louis Napoleon whose crime is that of setting up a personal government and ruling by his police, would be more leniently dealt with than Louis Philippe whose chief offence was a love for the accumulation of personal wealth. If the Emperor had only broadened the constitution he might have steered clear of the dangers which now beset him; it may be that it is too late to do it now even if he were inclined.
