I may say that the first business to engage the attention of the new Council should be the consolidating of the city debt, in order to lessen the rate of interest now being paid, which is a fraction less than 6 per cent. The amount of the city debt in round numbers is \$2,300,000. It is surprising that the Council has not dealt with this important question before, as the city has been paying this rate for many years, and no effort has been made on the part of the Council to lessen it. I have no doubt that money could have been obtained at a much lower rate, say from 3½ to a per cent, which would have made a yearly saving to the city of from \$40,000 to \$50,000. I moved in this matter, and the Council will apply to the Legislature for an act at its next sitting.

In this connection I wish to say that as the city government is at present constituted the mayor is ex-officio a member of the Board of Water Commissioners, Board of Police Commissioners, Hospital Trust and also a director of the London and Port Stanley Rallway*Company. He is supposed to represent the City Council's interests in these different bodies connected with the city government, and whose duty it is to report to the Council from time to time the business transacted in them and to advise with the Council in relation to the business to be done by these departments. Had this course been pursued in the past the taxes this year would have been 18 mills or less instead of 22.
