It will be remembered that during the administration of Mr. Mackenzie a number of crimes were committed in the country which greatly aroused the ire of the Tory The number of murders during one or two years was unusually large, though not larger in proportion to the population of the country than had happened at intervals in former periods. It was the fact also, as was shown by the official records, that the number upon whom capital punishment was inflicted was quite as large in proportion to the number of sentences as at any former period. But this did not prevent Tory politicians and Tory journals from openly arging the Government with responsibility for the epoch of crime, nor yet from brutally accusing the Minister of Justice with favoritism or worse ably Asiatic boatmen who were driven by because he saw fit in a few storms far out to sea and finally landed in cases to commute the capital sentence to imprisonment for life. No one is likely to bring the latter accusation against the present Minister of Justice, for if he errs at all it is on the other side. But if the Tories of fifteen years ago were right in holding that the frequent murders of that time were a consequence of Liberal ad-ministration, what have they to say of the carnival of crime through which the country has passed during the last ten years? CIVIL SERVICE AND COST OF LIVING.

An inquiry recently made by direction of the Government of Hong-Kong into the cost of living there in its relation to salaries paid to officers of the civil service is not wholly wishout interest in our case sound.
