BIG FAKE LOTTERY

Thousands of Persons Victimized by

The Scheme.

New York, Feb. 23.—Several de-

fectives and a postoffice inspector ar-

rested seven men yesterday on the

charge of running a "fake" lottery.

The police say that thousands of per-

sons have been victimized by the

scheme. Tickets, it is alleged, were sold

by agents throughout the country at

from 25 cents to \$2 each, and the al-

leged prizes ranged from \$4 to \$50.

It is charged that while great

representations were made by the pro-

moters and agents of the affair, no

drawings were ever held. The draw-

ings were supposed to be at

Pueblo, Mexico. Representatives of

the "company" were active in seeking
