

LIFE IN PRISON TAKING HEALTH FROM GARFIELD

Sentenced To 20 Years For Complicity In Murder of Ben Johnson.

BROTHER WAS HANGED
IN WOODSTOCK JAIL

Brothers Did Not See One Another After Tragic Meeting In Courtroom.

Fortified night and day with the story of a brother sent to the gallows, Denton Garfield, who is serving a 20-year sentence in Portsmouth penitentiary in connection with the murder of Ben Johnson, Woodstock confectioner, has failed rapidly since being sent to Kingston. This is the word of officials who have been at the Kingston institution.

Charged with his brother, Norman, with the murder of the Woodstock man, Denton Garfield, on the eve of the trial, sent for the crown attorney and signed a statement in which he swore that his brother had fired the shot that killed Mr. Johnson. He was tried first for the crime and was found guilty of manslaughter by the jury and was sentenced to 20 years. Norman Garfield was found guilty of first degree murder and was later hanged in the jail yard at the Oxford Court jail.

LAST TIME TOGETHER.
After the trial the brothers who were comrades in crime did not see one another again. They saw one another for the last time in the courtroom after the younger brother had given testimony as to the happenings on the night of the murder. When the younger was removed to Kingston penitentiary, neither brother wanted to see the other. Denton Garfield has been confined in the infirmary at the penitentiary and is said to have failed terribly in health since he was sentenced. He was for a time employed in the infirmary at the Kingston institution, but had to be removed from there and sent to the hospital on account of his sickness.

SCORE SCHOOLS USE FOR POOLS

Citizens Alarmed At Plethora of Holidays.

IS FALSE ECONOMY

Must Make Other Arrangements Next Year.

Many parents of the city are criticizing the Board of Education for closing the schools on Monday, December 5, to allow buildings to be used for the municipal polling. It has been the custom for the last few years to use the schools for this purpose and this saves the taxpayers a small sum annually. The Council pays the Board of Education for the use of the schools, but the money is still expended for civic purposes by the board. There was no objection so long as the voting was done on New Year's, but it is now contended that the work of the schools should not be stopped, even if a little money is saved thereby.

In this connection it is pointed out that there are so many holidays now that the children are not being given their just dues. The teachers' salaries continue, no matter how many additional holidays are given, but every extra day that the schools are closed to the pupils brings about direct loss to the children and to the community as a whole, it is asserted. Some of the trustees are not at all favorable to allowing the voting to be carried out in the schools this year for this reason. Nothing can be done about it now, although it is more than probable that the Council will be compelled to secure other polling booths next year.

WOMEN IN DANGER FROM FIRE ABOARD COLLIER

MONTREAL, Oct. 28.—One woman had to be carried off the William E. Hall, collier, from Erie, Pa., when fire broke out on board the ship last night and badly damaged the cabin.

The fire was first discovered by Miss Helen Lalonde, sister of the captain, who saw smoke coming from below and gave the alarm. Miss Lalonde and her sister, who also traveled on the ship and had sprained her ankle in the afternoon, was carried up the ladder by Miss Lalonde.

Five streams were used before the fire was brought under control.

Scheme To Breed Fur-Bearing Animals On Large Scale Is Frustrated By Government

Company Organized and 4,000 Acres of Land Secured, Only To Learn That Operations Must Be Limited To Six Acres.

TORONTO, Oct. 28.—Granted an "occupation license" for 4,180 acres of land in Northern Ontario by one department of the Government, in the expectation that it could be used for the breeding of fur-bearing animals, the Northern Rice Lake Fur Company, of Toronto, is indignant over the fact that another department refuses to allow more than six acres to be used for breeding purposes. It claims to have spent more than \$4,000 in preparing for the venture on a large scale.

The company was organized last June and includes several Toronto men who planned on making money raising fur-bearing animals. It secured the license

1,500 BOYS TO START CAMPAIGN NEXT WEEK FOR A HEALTHIER, CLEANER, PRETTIER LONDON

Rotary Club and Chamber of Commerce Backing Boys' Organizations In Work.

SURVEY OF FOUR WARDS
WILL BE FIRST ACTION

Lads Who Are Exerting Themselves On Behalf of City Are of 'Teen Age.

A cleaner, healthier, more beautiful London is the ideal for which 1,500 boys will work next week. At the request of the Chamber of Commerce and the Rotary Club all the organized boys' groups in the city will commence next Monday a six-day community service campaign, the like of which has not been known in the history of the Forest City.

Under competent leadership a survey of the four wards will be made and the city divided into 12 or 16 sections. To different organizations will be allotted various sections of the city and they will be charged with the responsibility of seeing that there is not a backyard, lane or vacant lot at which a visitor might point the finger of scorn.

Half of the lads who are interested in the campaign and who are partly responsible for its inception are the Tuxis boys and Trail Rangers, who are organized in the Boys' Council of the city. Co-operating with them are the Boy Scouts, the Roman Catholic League, the Young Judean Club and the Junior members of the Y. M. C. A. These six organizations are "all set" and awaiting the word "go" that will start them off on the big service movement for London.

MOVEMENT SPREADS.
This fall's campaign is attributable to the success of the initial "clean-up" campaign. Only the Boys' Council took part in that canvass of the city, but they were through the solicitation of the business men of the city, the movement has spread to all the boys' organizations which are interested in a better London. Rotarians, members of the Chamber of Commerce and others who know the true meaning of service realize the great work which the boys of the city have done and can do with sufficient encouragement.

The lads who are taking part in the effort are for the most part "teen age" boys. From 12 to 20 are the ages of the embryonic citizens who are evidencing a real civic interest and pride, and their leaders are for the most part young men, seasoned with a few more years' experience and capable of directing the ambitions of the younger ones in their charge. Back of the boys' effort is the boys' work board consisting of prominent business men who have the true altruistic spirit.

LEADERS ELECTED.
Boy Scouts will be lined up to the work by George Metcalf and M. Horton; the Roman Catholic League has Brothers Theobald and Gregory for leaders; the Young Judean Club is headed by I. Goldstick and Mayer Lerner; the Boys' Council by Mayor Allan Kay and Dave Phylanson; and the Y. M. C. A. by Junior Warden Wilson.

The boys have declared war, not only on all accumulations of filth and rubbish, but on those places which are a disgrace to the city. They are cleaning places for flies and germs will be raised, and deposits of paper, straw and wood which endanger property through fire, are being removed. In the community service campaign, back yards, downtown as well as in the residential districts, come under the scope of the survey.

In another practical way the boys are showing the spirit of service. This year they are to help old widows, infirm and aged people, visit their clean-up. Leaves will be raked up, ashes removed from cellar and yard and other acts of kindness done for the aged and those who are physically incapacitated.

BOARD CO-OPERATES.
The Board of Health is again co-operating with the organizations and any instances of particular filth will be dealt with by that department if reported to them by the boys. Mayor Little will also sign a proclamation calling upon all citizens to do their duty in the campaign, which has for its objective a bigger, better, more prosperous city of which everyone may be proud.

FEARS CRASH, JUMPS; FATHER NONORQUE KILLED

EDMONTON, N. B., Oct. 28.—Alighting on his head when he jumped from the automobile of a friend because he feared a collision with a rapidly-approaching motor car, Rev. Father Louis Nonorque, of Eagle Lake district, on Wednesday, received injuries which caused his death. There was no collision, the cars being checked before meeting each other.

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Self-Confessed Owner of Grand Trunk Pays \$2.25 For Ticket He Forgot

A small debt like \$2.25 is nothing in the young life of Charles Vanwiller, the self-confessed owner of the Grand Trunk Railway, who was arrested on the train between Toronto and Brantford, charged with "beating" his way.

In court in Brantford the charge was changed to that of owing the Grand Trunk Railway \$2.25, the price of his ticket.

"Huh, that's nothing," he declared. "Why, they owe \$20,000,000."

It was impressed upon Owner Vanwiller that while a corporate company might owe a score of millions and get away with it, the original owner of that company could not remain in its debt to the extent of \$2.25 without chancing trouble.

He paid the sum due and costs and left the courtroom vowing to lose no time in making sweeping changes in the road's management.

RAIL MEN GLAD STRIKE AVERTED 7 WEEKS' COURSE FOR S. S. LEADERS

Walkout In States Would Have Paralyzed Freight Traffic.

WILL REMAIN AT WORK

Local Men To Decide On 12½ Per Cent. Reduction Soon.

The announcement from Chicago that the threatened strike has been averted was gladly received by the local officials, as a walkout by the United States railway men would no doubt have paralyzed the freight traffic to and from the United States.

"I believe that railway men of the United States adopted a wise policy when they decided to remain at work," said one of the prominent officials to whom the news was given.

Representatives of the Canadian railway employees are in Montreal negotiating with the owners and are having matters ready in this manner. The cancellation board is expected to make its decision shortly as to whether or not it favors the appeal of the employees against the 12½ per cent. reduction made effective on the Canadian lines last July.

Joseph Corbett, representing the G. T. R. car men; James Grievous and A. H. Ball, of London, are among the railway men representing the employees.

HOUSE CERTAIN TO SUPPORT PREMIER

Lloyd George Will Likely Get Mandate To Proceed With Parley.

LONDON, Oct. 28.—The Irish conference has been suspended until after next Monday, the day set for a discussion in the House of Commons of the Government's policy in dealing with representatives of the Dail Eireann. Even the meetings of the committee of the Dail Eireann and the Government and Sinn Fein delegates have been suspended for to-day and to-morrow.

According to information obtained at Sinn Fein headquarters to-day, however, Prime Minister Lloyd George and Lord Chancellor Birkenhead may meet Arthur Griffith and Michael Collins, Irish members of the committee, on Monday. Some of the members of the Dail delegation, anticipating a blank check, had arranged to return to Ireland to-night, but Mr. Griffith asked them to remain in London, lest their return be misunderstood. Mr. Griffith desired that the delegation should review together the whole situation, preparatory to Monday's debate in the Commons. Sinn Fein circles were not apprehensive to-day regarding the debate, some of them saying it would serve to "clear the air," to bring out the essentials and enable them to see how far Parliament would authorize the prime minister to go. If they think this authorization should not extend far enough they intimated the conference might be broken off.

A LATE ARRIVAL.
The latest arrival at Sinn Fein headquarters is William Mulvany, a member of the Dail Eireann and one of the organizers of the Easter rebellion, who commanded the rebels in Galway and later escaped to the United States. Prime Minister Lloyd George will confront the House of Commons next Monday to ask for a mandate relative to the course of the negotiations between delegates of the Government and the Dail Eireann. Announcement to this effect by the prime minister yesterday brought to a head the seemingly serious situation which has developed during the past fortnight by the alleged defection of Unionist leaders and constituencies from support of the coalition Government.

7 WEEKS' COURSE FOR S. S. LEADERS

Lectures For Sunday School Teachers Begin Thursday.

COVER WIDE FIELD

London First City In Province To Initiate Plan.

As a result of the enterprise of the local Religious Education Council, London, a group of teachers will provide leadership for all branches of boys' work. Next Thursday will mark the commencement of a seven-week course, in which every Protestant church will be represented. It is hoped.

The idea was also brought up at the annual convention of the Religious Education Council for Western Ontario, which was concluded in Brantford yesterday. The London delegates, who explained their tentative program, state that there was a wealth of sentiment developed in its favor which will probably result in many other communities adopting the scheme and putting it into operation throughout the province.

All teachers, prospective teachers, officers of Sunday school organizations and others who are vitally interested in boys' work are invited to attend this initial meeting on Thursday, G. W. Hoffer, president of the London Religious Education Council, will preside at this class and will commence the study of the "Teacher's Bible," by L. A. Weigle.

GROUP STUDY
At 8.45 each night students of the course will divide into their respective groups for practical study of the course.
