



TRINITY COLLEGE, TORONTO.

THE ANNUAL EXAMINATION FOR MATRICULATION, and for SCHOLARSHIPS, takes place Yearly in OCTOBER.

The following Scholarships will be open to competition :—

FOUR FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS, tenable for three years, viz. :—One of 30*l.* currency per annum ; one of 25*l.* ; and two of 20*l.*

ONE CAMERON SCHOLARSHIP, tenable for three years, of the annual value of 25*l.* currency ; appropriated to the sons of Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland, who shall be at the time resident and doing duty in British North America, or who, having fulfilled these conditions, shall have been incapacitated by age or sickness, or removed by death. A preference will be given, *ceteris paribus*, to candidates intending to receive Holy Orders.

The holders of these Scholarships will be required to attend Lectures and Examinations in the Arts course.

All persons presenting themselves for examination must produce testimonials of good conduct. Candidates for Matriculation must have entered on their Sixteenth, and Candidates for Scholarships on their Seventeenth year.

The subjects of examination may be learned by application to the Provost of Trinity College, who will furnish any other information which may be required.

ONE WELLINGTON SCHOLARSHIP, of the annual value of 50*l.* currency, tenable for two years ; and one BISHOP STRACHAN, one ALLAN, and one DICKSON SCHOLARSHIP, each of the annual value of 30*l.* currency, and tenable for three years, will be awarded to Students commencing their College Course in October next, according to the result of the yearly examination in the following June.

N.B.—Students intending to study for Holy Orders will be eligible as candidates for Divinity Scholarships, either after having graduated in Arts, or after having spent one year at least in the Arts course ; provided, in the latter case, that they have entered on their twenty-second year and have been considered qualified for entering the Theological class.

FOUR DIVINITY SCHOLARSHIPS, one of 30*l.* currency per annum ; two of 15*l.*, and one of 20*l.*, tenable for two years, will be annually open for competition, in addition to one JUBILEE SCHOLARSHIP, of the value of 40*l.* currency per annum, tenable for two years, and restricted to the most deserving Bachelor of the year, who, having graduated in honours, shall have expressed his intention of studying for Holy Orders.
