Your Committee rejoice to perceive that in several districts of the Province, Divisions have resumed working, and your Committee trust that not only will they continue to progress, but that their example will be found to have a beneficial influence upon other localities, and induce Divisions to struggle on, assured that in this as well as every other good work, steady perseverance will be crowned with ultimate success.

The practise of admitting Female visitors to Division Meetings is becoming more general, and your Committee believe that the practice will ever be found most beneficial to the cause of Temperance, as a great social, as well as Moral Reform.

The resolution passed at the last Annual Session, respecting meetings of P. W. P's, does not appear to have been acted upon except in the capital, the Committee would urge upon Deputies an early attention to this matter as well calculated to advance the welfare of the Order.

In concluding this hasty report your Committee are inclined to feel much encouragement and to look hopefully to the future, satisfied of the goodness of the Cause, and the certainty that God will eventually in his own time and way give an abundant blessing to our efforts.
