CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO

The present condition of the lumber trade is not very different from that which prevailed one week ago. The volume of business is about normal, and there is practically no change in prices. Country shipments are not as heavy as might be expected, but on the other hand there is a more active demand in Toronto, where building operations continue brisk. Attempts to break prices of white pine, on the ground that manufacturers are carrying larger stocks than one year ago, have not been very successful, which leads to the conclusion that white pine is upon a stable foundation. There is no doubt that the percentage of this year's cut still in the hands of producers is considerably larger than at the corresponding time last year, but this is offset by the contemplated curtailment in logging operations the coming winter. Camps were put into the woods later than usual, the general disposition being to curtail the output by about 25 per cent.

Dealers are contracting quite liberally for hardwoods, but have found no difficulty in fulfilling their wants. Prices are quite firm, however, and an active fall demand may bring about an advance in some lines. Basswood is showing more life.

UNITED STATES.

The lumber market of the United States as a whole is exhibiting a strength that is encouraging to producers. There is the usual fall movement of northern pine, as there has lately been considerable buying of stock for shipment before the close of navigation. There is very little lumber for sale in the Lake Superior district, which, considered in connection with the moderate demand which has prevailed during the year, is but additional evidence that the supply of white pine timber is becoming exhausted. There has been an advance of 50 cents in the price of No. 1 boards. No. 2 and 3 boards are moving rapidly to supply the box demand, which is more active. Buffalo and Tonawanda dealers are booking larger orders for New York. Spruce prices are steady and dealers appear satisfied with the outlook. Some of the eastern mills have already shut down.

The hardwood trade is each day getting into better condition, both inquiries and orders being more numerous. There is a fair stock of hardwoods remaining in the hands of manufacturers, but no greater than is likely to be required before the new cut is ready next year, and if the demand should revive as many predict, a shortage may result. It is estimated that there are 30,000,000 feet of inch maple held by Michigan manufacturers. Thick maple, however, is in light demand and
