PANOPEPTON

A Source of Scientific Clinical Data

ANOPEPTON is primarily designed as a food for the sick, to be used under conditions of the body quite different from those obtaining in the use of ordinary foods, and is to be judged therefore by clinical as well as chemical data.

Panopepton is absolutely constant in composition, accurately "balanced" with respect to content of protein and carbohydrate, of uniform quality, and these facts give important scientific value to clinical observations on its effects.

It is found that **Panopepton** is retained where all other forms of food are rejected, that it revives animation at critical times, has peculiar value as a conserver of energy and a stimulus to restoration.

Altogether, considering what it is and what it does for the patient, clinical results from Panopepion afford just as scientific and significant data as can be obtained by the combustion of food in the "bomb" of the laboratory, or the estimation, according to the calorimeter, of the amount of food used up in the system.
