"Trichinopoly is bnth the name of a dis rict or Collectoralo. and in alao tho manie of its principal town. The Distride is
cut in tro lay the river Cravery. This cut intwo hy the river Cravery, This
water-way han a large branch whiloh separates frome it elovon milos above th town of Trichinopoly. For a consider able distance after their severanoe the
younger runs nearly parallel with the Tho island and hon anmost rejoins it. Tho isinnd-for auch it prnctically ie onclosed by the fwo rrore, is exceed ingly rich. It is full of coca palma, and fire, it a most bawer-like fond picy frond appeamnce. In the midat of all flied neetled the holy town of Sirangham. With a population of about 11,000 , a uanjber f very largo and riohly ondowed tom las, dedicnted to Vishapu, and covsider d one of the most shered phaces of prilgri ange in the whole of South India. It is nopoly.
The Collectorate of Trichinopoly : very fertilo in the river valleys, but poor
