

**Government Business:—Concluded.**

4. Government Business to have precedence up to and including March 28; motion *re*, agreed to, 157.
  5. Debate on Address to have precedence over Government Notices of Motion, etc., on Wednesday, March 12, 1947, notwithstanding resolution of March 7, 1947; motion *re*, agreed to, 176.
  6. Government Business to have precedence up to and including April 28, with certain exceptions, including Private and Public Bills on Tuesday and Friday; motion *re*, moved and agreed to, 276.
  7. Order for House in Committee of Ways and Means (Budget) to be proceeded with on Tuesday, April 29, at 8 p.m. (Private Bill hour); motion *re*, moved and agreed to, 353.
  8. Government Business to have precedence on Mondays and Wednesdays; motion *re*, agreed to, 365.
  9. Government Business to have precedence on Tuesday and Friday evenings during Private and Public Bill hour now provided for under Standing Order 15; Wednesday evenings also taken for sittings of the House; motion *re*, moved and agreed to, after debate, 436.
  10. Business on Saturdays to be the same as on Fridays; motion *re*, 716.
