Pursuant to Standing Order 58, Mr. Andre (Calgary Centre), seconded by Mr. Baker (Grenville-Carleton), moved,—That this House deplores the continuing decline in Canada's scientific and technological effort and urges the government to adopt a meaningful science policy that will lead to increased industrial research and development, increased scientific research and increased utilization of Canada's scientists and engineers, thereby contributing to the long-term benefit of both Canadians and the Canadian economy.
