FISHERIES

REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO NEWFOUNDLAND FISHERMEN UNABLE TO PROSECUTE FISHERY BECAUSE OF ICE CONDITIONS—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

Mr. Jack Marshall (Humber-St. George's-St. Barbe): Mr. Speaker, I wish to move a motion under the provisions of Standing Order 43 on a matter of urgent and pressing necessity, and I am sure the Minister of State responsible for fisheries (Mr. LeBlanc) will agree to it.

Ice conditions in various fishing areas of Newfoundland prompt the need for government to implement a program of special financial assistance to alleviate the financial suffering of fishermen in those areas, because of their inability to prosecute the fishery this year. The situation is more serious because of the fact that Unemployment Insurance Commission benefits expired on May 15 for fishermen.

I therefore move, seconded by the hon. member for St. John's West (Mr. Carter):

That the government of Canada take immediate action, in co-operation with the provincial government of Newfoundland, to declare a disaster in those areas affected and to provide financial relief through appropriate programs

SUGGESTED ESTABLISHMENT OF GUARANTEED ANNUAL INCOME AND OPTIONAL RETIREMENT AT 60—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43
