

ARTICLE V.

Sec. 1.—If any member is suspended or excluded from the Lodge, the Secretary shall immediately give notice thereof to the Grand Secretary and the D. D. G. M.

Sec. 2.—If required by the Master, any Brother presenting any subject for the consideration of the Lodge must put the same in writing, and every Brother rising to discuss a question must confine himself to the subject presented and avoid personalities so far as possible, and no Brother will be allowed to speak more than twice, or for a longer period than five minutes, on any one subject without permission from the Master. Should any controversy arise as to the right to the floor, the Master shall decide.

No Brother shall interrupt another while speaking without the consent of the Master.

Sec. 3.—Any member who may be found guilty of any gross acts of willful disobedience of the laws of his country or humanity may be suspended by the Lodge, after having duly notified him of the charge preferred or complaint against him, and of the time appointed for consideration and trial as provided in the Constitution.

ARTICLE VI.

All the jewels and funds of the Lodge shall be vested in the Master and Wardens, and no money shall be drawn from the treasury except by order of the Master and a vote of the Lodge, except the payment of notes, which may have become due, that have been signed by the order of the Master with the consent of the Lodge, which may be paid by the Treasurer.
