TO FORM BIBLE UNION

British Committee Named to Further Scheme-Strong Appeal Made.

LONDON, Nov. 7 .- (C. A. P.)-The controversy aroused by the delivery of the Fernley lecture by the Rev. Geo Jackson, formerly of Toronto, and president of Didsbury Theological College, is still disturbing the minds of a good many Wesleyans. An appeal has just been put forward for the formation of a Wesley Bible Union "for the encouragement of divine Biblical research and for the maintenance of the divine authority of the Lord Jesus Christ and the Holy Scripture."

"Departure From Fundamentals." "Thruout the world earnest Christians have for years past mourned over a widespread departure from some fundamental tenets of the Christian faith." says the appeal. "Signs of this movement have for a considerable period been evident in Wesleyan Methodism, and the conference at Plymouth in July last revealed the fact that we are face last revealed the fact that we are face to face with a great doctrinal crisis. The Fernley lecture of 1912 on 'The Preacher and the Modern Mind,' Indicated in plain and unequivocal English whither we are tending, and how far we have already drifted from the faith of our fathers. To most Methodists the revelation was unexpected and sudden, and they were found ill-prepared for the occasion. But as time passes, concern and alarm are spreading.

"The book in question and other writings of its author are an emphatic challenge to all who hold the doctrines formulated by Wesley, and the position is rendered the more serious by the is rendered the more serious by the fact that the conference itself set the seal of its approval on the teachings of the lecture. Hence, anyone now may promulgate these teachings without fear

of conference censure."
