FOREIGN CORN IS TENDERED FREELY

Wheat and Oats Shared Heaviness at Chicago-Free Imports Expected.

CHICAGO, Jan. 6.—Cheap offers of shipments from the Danube, as well as from Argentina brought about a downward swing today in corn. The market closed heavy, %c to 1c to 1%c under last night. Wheat finished %c to ½c net lower, oats down ½c to %c, and provisions unchanged to 7½c off.

Prices at which both Danubian and Argentine corn were offered in ship loads to be delivered in Atlantic ports of the United States seemed to many speculators here to indicate probable large sales by Argentina to this country, whatever the result might be in regard to the offers from Europe. Bears ignored despatches from Texas that experience there with the Argentine grain had been unsatisfactory and that Texas buyers were now looking to St. Louis for a supply.

were now looking to St. Louis for a supply.

Lack of any adequate demand for cash corn here had considerable to do with the rapidity with which the price of futures gave way. Except that covering by shorts at the outset furnished impetus for a temporary swell the market thruout suffered from unloading by holders and from speculative selling.

Free imports From Canada.

Chances that free imports from Canada would soon be a reality put wheat bulls at a disadvantage. Millers and investors appeared to be more and more reluctant to buy. There was a show of strength carly, based in part on higher cables and parity on the smallness of receipts northwest of here, but the market soon wavered, especially after corn began to sag. Values displayed no sign of any power to rally.

Pressure from Canadian receipts here

to rally.

Pressure from Canadian receipts here was in the main responsible for oats being to the lowest price of the season for May delivery. For a while pit traders attempted to cling to the bull side, but finally were forced to let go.

Grain longs selling out weakened provisions. Declining prices for hogs tended also to drag down the market.




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
