NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR DEVELOPMENT

Productive Field for Oil and Gas in the Making.

NEAR TILLSONBURG

Despite War Conditions, Considerable Attention Being Paid by Financiers.

By a Staff Reporter.

TILLSONBURG, Oct. 11. — Despite war conditions and their effect on the investment market considerable attention is being paid to the Tillsonburg oil and gas district, which extends from Delhi, a short distance from the west of here as far south as Port Burfrom Delhi, a short distance from the west of here as far south as Port Burwell, on Lake Erie. Since the discovery of paying black oil of exceptionally high grade, on the Eureka Gas and Oil Development Syndicate's property, about eight miles south of here a short time ago, the attention of well-known financial men and oil and gas interests has been directed to the district in the vicinity of Tillsonburg. It is now almost impossible to secure is now almost impossible to secure leases on farms near here, as those farmers who still retain their oil rights are asking exceedingly high prices for

Varied Interests There. French, British, American and Canadian interests are represented in large holdings near here in the Town-ships of Bayham, Middleton and Hough ton, in the Counties of Elgin and Norfolk. The members of the French syndicate, controlling several hundred acres, were recalled to France by the war, when they had a large scheme of development work well under way. British interests have been affected in the same way, but by information re-ceived from men closely in touch with the oil and gas field it will not be long before they will again have develop-ment work well under way.

ere are several wells almost in the Town of Tillsonburg. The ma-jority of these are at a depth of slightly over four hundred feet when oil is desired. Probably the greatest feature about the field is that the oil secured is of a much higher grade than that from any other field in Can-ada. A test made at the Eureka well yesterday showed that the oil regis-tered 41½ degrees Baume. This entitles it to a substantial bonus above the ordinary market for crude oil. A representative of the company stated yesterday that further development work on this well wa sneeded to get the best results, and that the drilling of several others on the company's properties would be gone ahead with shortly.

Runs Thirty Feet Deep.
Possibly the greatest indication of
the possibilities of this district is the depth of the corniferous limestone or the pay streak in which oil is found. in Petrolea and other oil fields of Canada and the United States the layer of porous corniferous limestone runs about two feet thick. In the Tillsonburg district and to the south of here the oil-producing depth of rock runs as great as thirty feet,

For many years this cil and gas area has been supplying gas to Buffalo. From fourteen wells put down by the Provincial Natural Gas and Fuel Company in Haldimand and Welland Counties sufficient gas has been obtained to not only supply Buffalo, but Niagara, Chippewa, Bridgeburg, Fort Erie, Sherkston, Stevensville, Crystal Beach and many other immediate points.

A pipe line extending all the way from Port Burwell to Tillsonburg col-lects the gas, for which the pipe line company pays the well-owner. In this way the cost of operating a gas well in this district has been brought to nominal figure.

Nearby Tillsonburg, among other gas wells developed by many companies, are two large wells which are becoming widely known thruout the country. These wells are owned by the Dominion Gas and Oil Comgany and nave a capacity flow of 7,000,000 and 4,000,000 feet per day respectively. This gas supplies Tillsonburg, Aylmer and other towns in this vicinity with natural ras. ral gas.

Will be Many Wells.

Probably the most active of the companies operating in this vicinity is the Eureka Gas and Oil Development Syndicate, owners of the Eureka well, the first of importance to be discovered. This syndicate is subdividing 521 acres into different sections and has guaranteed to drill a well on every ten acres of its property as the leases are sold. By a novel scheme, not only will the purchaser of a section deriv ewhatever benefits might accrue by drilling himself, but will also participate in the profits of the wells drilled by the syndicate. This new West Ontario gas and oil field promises to eclipse any other fields in Canada, and capital for developmen will flow in freely as soon as the merits of the field are more widely known.

Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain conditions.
