and if \(\frac{1}{2}\) c. commission and freight be added, a disparity is reached which does not admit of easy explanation, unless it be that "finest Townships" means something different in the country from what it does in the city. A leading dealer has no manner of doubt that he could get 18c. for straight lots of finest Townships, and justifies his belief by the fact that he is effecting sales of 'Morrisburg at 174c. for round lots. The trade is quite agreed that \(\frac{1}{2}\) crepresents the minimum difference in value of butter from the two sections at this time of year. We learn of other sales, carlier in the week, 100 packages Townships at 18c and 50 packages, extra choice at 18\(\frac{1}{2}\) o, also Morrisburg, size of lots not stated, at 18c. We quote Townships choice lines, 17c. to 18c.; Morrisburg and Brockville, 16\(\frac{1}{2}\) c. to 17c\(\frac{1}{2}\). Western, 16c. to 16c. \(\frac{1}{2}\) Olderse.—The demand for shipment is fully equal to incoming supplies, and stocks are kept moderately low. The highest figure named for fixest quality is 12c. and 11\(\frac{1}{2}\) c. is accepted as the basis for ordinary dealings. Market inactive. At the Ingersoft market this week seventeen factories registered 3,254 boxes, mostly first half of May pake; fourteen factories present who did not register, laving sold to 10th inst. 1,280 boxes sold at 11\(\frac{1}{2}\) c. 1,374 at 11\(\frac{1}{2}\) c. 330 at 11c. Ten buyers present. At Little Falls, May 24th, 5,000 boxes sold at 12c. to 13c., average 12\(\frac{1}{2}\) c. 1,400 boxes on commission. Eggs.—Remain at 10\(\frac{1}{2}\) c., with no appreciable change in the state of the market.

Wook.—The quiet tone of the market for domestic as reported last week still continues. Some small parcels of new wool have been marketed at a price which is purely nominal at the early stage of the market. We hear of various prices being paid at different points of Canada, but so far the quantity offered is so small no actual price has or could be established. General coninon seems to agree that 32c to 35c in the West, 28 to 32c in the Eastern portions of the country will be the ruling figures. The late reports from the London and Boston markets are now having a noticeable influence here. The confident tone of a few weeks ago has quite disappeared; and holders of foreign wool are willing to consider bids that would then have been treated with indifference. The outside price for Grensy Cape, unless for a specially choice quality, is now admitted to be 22c, a concession of ic from previous asking rate. Business is very quiet, as is usually the case when values appear to be settling.
