WANTS TO BUILD SPUR TO FACTORY

Hamilton Company Will Remove if Permission is Not Granted.

TO FIGHT EXTRADITION

American Financiers Anxious to Secure Stocks in Steel Corporation.

HAMILTON, Wednesday, Oct. 6.—Last night the works committee recommended to the city council that permission be granted the E. T. Wright Co., Ltd., to erect a spur line into its factory for shipping purposes, along Kelley street from the Grand Trunk tracks on Ferguson avenue. The question had been considered for some time and last night the matter was discussed at some length before the decision was finally reached. The majority of residents of Kelley street and the vicinity, who were represented by the committee, made strong objections to the city granting the permit on the grounds that the spur line would detract considerably from the value of the property.

The committee recommended that the spur line be given a free site for its factory, exempt from taxation, and that a bonus would be given for the plant was established there. It was also stated that the company would remove its factory from Hamilton if the permit was not granted.

The permit was recommended on condition that the property on the south side of Kelley street from Ferguson avenue easterly, within two months, be cleared of all buildings and structures which cannot be agreed on between the company and the city. The matter shall be referred to Judge Sider, as sole arbitrator. In case any owner does not desire to sell, the matter shall be referred to the court to make an award for the damage done to adjacent property.

Wants Sewers Diverted.

Charles Hetherington, representing the Hamilton sewer commission, appeared before the committee and requested that the various factories flowing untreated into the bay be diverted and that they flow into the Ferguson avenue disposal plant. The committee agreed to divert the sewage to the treatment plant.

Will Fight Extradition.

Charles Hetherington, who was arrested at the request of the Chicago police, to depart for Chicago to face extradition charges. He has retained George S. Kerr, governing the extradition to the laws of this country, and is fighting extradition.

Leaves for Berlin.

Harry Quinn of the Hamilton fire department has been selected by the City Council as fire chief of the local department for eleven years.

Have No Election This Year.

Premier of Greece Finds Policy Thwarted by the King.

GREEK MOBILIZATION COMPLETED.

A belated despatch from Athens dated September 30 said that the expected Greek mobilization had been completed by Sunday night (October 3), and that Greece was able to put 180,000 men fully equipped into the field, adding that the mobilization, which included men up to 45 years of age, probably would call for 300,000 troops, but that only 180,000 could be armed. It was said the government had sufficient funds to continue on a war footing for one month, but that the problem was to obtain money from the triple entente powers. The despatch continued:

"The signing of the mobilization order created general relief here. It was considered an extraordinary triumph for Premier Venizelos, who is known to have had a long struggle with King Constantine before the monarch would yield to the premier's wishes.

A Destination a Secret.

A curious and disconcerting feature of the Greek mobilization is the ignorance of the mobilized men as to their destination or the purpose for which they were called to the colors. The newspapers, which usually indulge in the freest expression of opinion, are generally silent respecting the fate of the Serbian-Greek treaty of alliance, which the king all along has maintained was abrogated by the Serbians owing to their concessions to Bulgaria, and the effectiveness of which today is the key to the future action of Greece."
