

JAWBONE AT COLUMBIA EASILY WINS FEATURE

Weather Ideal, Speculation Brisk,
But Only Two Favorites First
at Fair Grounds Track.

COLUMBIA, Dec. 28.—Ideal racing weather and a card above the average brought out a large crowd to the Fair Grounds to-day. Speculation was brisk on all races. Two favorites won. THREE HEATS LEAVE 2.15 PAGE UNDECIDED

Ideal Weather For Ice Races at
Dufferin Park—Two Races
Finished.

The harness horse enthusiasts who were complaining about the mild weather when the Toronto Driving Club winter races opened Christmas Day had real winter weather served up to them in vigorous style yesterday afternoon at Dufferin Park as the nor'wester that blew across the grounds and into the faces of the spectators was "some wind, and carried with it plenty of frost."

The track was frozen, of course, and very good, but not fast by any means, as the snow covering was loose and the horses slipped more or less, but the racing was exciting from the start and no one left the track disappointed.

The attendance was very good, considering the day, and included many noted horsemen from different parts of the country.

The racing began with the unfinished 2.30 trot, which was carried over from Christmas Day. In this race were Lesa Vale, Princess Eleanor, The Reprobate and Monarchical Lady, the first two having each won two heats when time was up Monday, and in the auction-pool selling before the final heat they were equally favored. However, there was nothing to the race yesterday but Lesa Vale, as the others were untied all through the mile. Monarchical Lady trotted fairly well until the final eighth, when she broke and ran to the wire, her driver, Jimmy Eason, being unable to control her. She finished ahead of Lesa Vale, but the judges placed her last for her long gallop.

The 2.30 pace went four heats before the favorite, The Undertaker, in Charlie Barrett's string, carried off the honors. The first heat was a stunner between Pat McCarthy's A.L.P.
