

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 15.-The Russo-Japanese convention, which was signed by M. Iswolsky, the Russian minister of foreign affairs, and Dr. Molono, the Japanese minister to Russia, on July 30 last, was published

"Article 1.-Each contracting party undertakes to respect the present territorial integrity of the other, as from setting aside some bylaws of the company. Mr. Barnard some weeks ago issued a writ against Mr. Broughtins now in force between the high contracting parties and China, copie of which have been exchanged by the contracting powers, so far as these rights are not incompatible with the principle of equal opportunities enunciated in the treaty signed at Ports mouth, N.H., Sept. 5, 1905, and the special conventions concluded between Japan and Russia

"Article II .- Both contracting parties recognize the independence and territorial integrity of the Chinese empire, as well as the principle of equa opportunities in commerce and industry for all nations in said empire They also pledge themselves to the maintenance of the status quo and the respect of this principle the peaceable means at their disposal." Vouch for Peace.

The text of the Russo-Japanes reaty recognizing the independence and territorial integrity of the Chinese empire and pledging the two countries to the maintenance of the status quo which was made public to-day, was well received on all sides. The Conservative and Liberal news papers display remarkable unanimity in agreeing that it establishes the relations between the two powers on a

sound basis, guaranteeing unbroken peace for a long period. The Novoe Vremya expresses the opinion that the treaty is the turning point in Russia's Asiatic policy, enabing her to shift her attentions hereafter to nearest Russia, after having carefully weighed the arguments in favor of waging a return war for the recovery of lost ground in Man-churia, and having finally decided to accept the situation as it is, abandon ing all idea of a war of revenge.

TOKIO, Aug. 15 .- It is believed here hat the Russo-Japanese treaty cludes a clause, which has not been published specifically, defining the respective spheres of influence of the wo countries. Under this clause it is reported that a portion of the Sungari River is placed within Japan's sphere, thereby modifying the exclusive rights of navigating that streams which were conferred upon Russia by the treaty of Aigun.
