He was given a room, and, after taking a drink, retired. To-night he was found dead in his room with a severe gash in his wrist, the arteries having been severed. The man, whose name is supposed to be Collins, is said to be an absconding railroad man from St. Louis. His shirt bears the mark of Giers, Pine-street, St. Louis, and his hat is stamped Emerich, Pittsburg, Kansas. Pápers found on his person gave the clue to his name, and also that he was a member of a lodge of Free Masons in St. Albans, Vermont.
