Mission of Ambassader Creel in Montreal.

Mentreal, Que., Aug. 10. -- It is learned, from reliable financial sources. that the visit of Engene C. Creel, Mexican ambassador to the United the past three days, and who left for Ottawa to discuss with Sir Wilfrid Laurier some important developments in connection with the relations of the Dominion and the great isthmian republic, was of very great financial

significance.
