## FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR NEW NATIONAL GALLERY

## Question No. 2,241—Mr. Herbert:

- 1. What has been the cost, to date, of the feasibility study for the new National Gallery?
- 2. What is the estimated total cost of the study?
- 3. To whom has the principal amount been paid?
- 4. What is the (a) description of the site on which the construction is projected (b) total area of the site?

Mr. Alexandre Cyr (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Public Works): 1. The limited architectural competitions and the related expenditures undertaken on the National Gallery cannot be classified as feasibility studies. Planning studies have been performed on the Wellington West planning precinct jointly between Public Works and the National Capital Commission. However, these were undertaken prior to the decision to locate the National Gallery on the presently proposed site and at the time were not directly concerned with the National Gallery. Studies connected with the suitability of the site for the National Gallery were done within Public Works and the National Capital Commission, and therefore no significant costs were incurred.
