This handsome_volume of 455 pages has been compiled by Victor Spears, a newspaper man of Buffalo, from information supplied him by John Wilson Murray, inspector of the department of criminal investigation of the department of riminal investigation of the department of justice, whose head offices are in the parliament buildings of our own city. 



The usual crop of aldermanic candidates is coming out. Thomas E. Rawson has announced himself in Ward Three, with the qualifications of experience in the Barrie town council and as a financial expert.

S. W. Black is being strongly urged to run for Ward Six as an aldermanic candidate. Mr. Black is a well-known business man, and popular wills all classes having resided to Parkdale over 25 years.

The labor candidates will be Jannes Wilsen, in Ward One, and T. V. Todd, in Ward Six. John Tweed and ex-Ald. Moses will run on the board of education tleket.
