MAY BE HOSTILITY TO BARON KOMURA

Japanese Minister Predicts That He Will Have VERY HARD TIME When He Reaches Tokio-- Minister of Home Affairs Resigns As Well As Tokio's Chief of Police--The Situation Threatening.

SEATTLE, Sept. 12.—That Baron Komura, the Japanese peace plenipotentiary, and his party may be met with a hostile demonstration on his arrival in Japan is the opinion expressed last night by Rev. H. Kozaki, prominent Japanese minister, who arrived here yesterday to attend a meeting of the American board of missionaries.

TOKIO, Sept. 12, 8.30 a. m.—The resignation of Yasuomi Yoshikawa, minister of home affairs, has been accepted. The Evangelical Alliance has passed a resolution that it will not facilitate a claim for damages for the destruction caused to churches, schools and missionary houses during the rioting in Tokio.

TOKIO, Sept. 12, 10 a. m.—The resignation of Adachi, chief of the metropolitan police, is hailed with delight as showing the conciliatory attitude of the government.
