

The following statistical table shows that the society occupies 17 Stations in Canada West, 5 in Prince Edward Island, and 6 in the United States of America; on which are laboring 41 Missionaries, assisted by 132 Local Preachers, who preach in 85 chapels, and 121 other places; having under their care 3010 members, 56 Sabbath Schools, 472 Teachers, 2917 Scholars; which shows an increase, including Prince Edward Island District, of 4 stations, 13 Itinerant, and 21 Local Preachers, 28 chapels, 17 other places, 646 members, 78 Teachers, and 557 Scholars.
