mated at £274,810 sterling, viz: 327,501 qtls dry fish, and 66,417 bbls pickled fish.

The reader will observe that much of the miscellaneous information in this Almanack refers to the year 1840. This could not very easily be avoided, as the Public Accounts for the year 1841 would not be made up until some weeks after the time when it was necessary that this Almanack should be put to Press, and therefore the amount of revenue received, and expenses incurred, could not possibly be ascertained.
