TOLE GERMAN CHURNS AROUSE OFFICIAL IRE. Amsterdam, Nov. 23.—The Weer Zeitung prints an order of the governor of the district of Ahaus exposing a combination of farmers and others who decided to stop making butter owing to the low maximum price fixed by the government. The order says: "This is assisting the enemies 'starving out' tactics. Strong punitive measures will be adopted and the members of the combination also will be excluded in future from the municipal distribution of fodder and provisions."

Philadelphia, Nov. 22.—The will of the late Peter A. B. Widener, admitted to probate today, leaves the greater part of his estate, estimated between \$50,000,000 and \$70,000,000, to his son, Joseph E. Widener, in trust. Joseph Widener, under the terms of the will, is given complete authority over his father's collection of paintings and art works, considered one of the most valuable in America. Mr. Widener had but two children, Joseph E. and George D. Widener. The latter lost his life when the Titanic went down. The dead son's share in the estate is to be divided equally among his descendants. The will makes no charitable bequests, Mr. Widener having given much of his wealth to this purpose in his life time.

Sir—Your editorial of the 22nd inst. re "Ministers and Others" was interesting because of the information which it contained concerning the intention of the "dean of St. Paul's Cathedral in Detroit" to spend a year's vacation not in rest and travel, but "in the sociological department of a great automobile factory." Laudable as his intention may be, perhaps the "dean" has not lived his life in such close contact with his fellow-men as he might have done? It is scarcely necessary for the minister to go into "a great automobile factory" in order that he may be able "to preach a more vital and practical Christianity." The Christian ministry, like the medical and legal professions, affords a magnificent opportunity for the study of human needs and problems. Your editorial was interesting, too, because of its advocacy of ministerial training to include a practical knowledge of social needs and problems. I should like to say, Mr. Editor, in order to correct any misunderstanding of the present attitude of the Christian ministry toward the ranks of labor, that the very thing which you have suggested, viz, the early acquisition on the part of the minister of "a knowledge of the principles of sociology" is being taught, and for some time now, has been taught in our theological colleges, and is included in the mental equipment and education of the minister. I have before me the calendar of the Montreal Theological College affiliated to McGill University for 1915-1916. Under the head of pastoral training, you will find not only homiletics and pastoral theology, and Sunday school pedagogics, but sociology. This is a general course in sociology. A footnote says: "This course traces the history of individualism and of the modern social consciousness. It finds in the teachings of Jesus great practical principles, and makes careful study of them as applied to some phases of the social problem, such as wealth, care of the poor, and the industrial order. There is included in this curriculum 'special social problems.' This is a social course in various phases of social

welfare. So you will see, Mr. Editor, that the instruction in "the principles of sociology" which you have suggested be imparted to the minister, is being given—what is true of the four theological colleges of Montreal (that splendid federation which comprises the Congregational College of Canada, the Diocesan Theological College, the Presbyterian College and the Wesleyan Theological College) is true of all the theological colleges of any note today. It may not be generally known that such instruction is now a part of the mental equipment of every minister, and it is simply to correct a difference of opinion that might be gained from the editorial in question, that I have ventured to write upon so important a matter as the relation of the minister to sociology. One word more. I am convinced that the ministers of St. John today constitute a body of men who, day by day, and week by week, earnestly apply themselves to the social conditions of our city. I believe that they are doing vastly more along these lines of social betterment, than they ever receive credit for, or any public acknowledgement, being content to serve their fellow-men, not for any prize of men, and to follow their great Master "when went about doing good."
