The first contingent of harvesters for the western grain fields passed through the city on Saturday. About 500 men came from Digby on the Empress, being from various points in Nova Scotia. There were also some local boys. The train left in two sections. It is estimated that the number of men going on these two trains totalled about 1,800.

It has been decided to operate a mail car service on the Valley Railway between Fredericton and Centerville, and the first trip will be made tomorrow. There will also be inaugurated several rural mail delivery routes which have been made possible by the Valley Railway.

MURDER IN NOVA SCOTIA

Digby, N. S., Aug. 13—Digby has another murder case. There is, however, but little excitement as no mystery surrounds the guilty one. From the evidence brought out at the coroner's inquest, it appears that Charles Roberts, colored, a fireman on the steamer Prince Georges, running between Boston and Yarmouth, came up on yesterday's Blue Nose, hired an automobile and was driven to the home of Luke Frances, at Westville, a village near Digby, where his wife, also colored, had been staying since Wednesday. Without any special warning he drew a 38-calibre revolver and shot her through the shoulder, killing her almost instantly. He then came out to the road and returned to Digby in the same automobile. At the post office he gave himself up to Chief of Police Peck, at the same time handing him the revolver.

He said: "She has fooled me long enough; she broke up my home, sold my stuff, and I made up my mind she would never do it again. I have fixed her, I think, and I am willing to take the consequences."

The affair took place at about 11:30. An inquest was held yesterday afternoon at which the following verdict was returned.

"We, the jury empanelled to enquire into the death of Kitty Roberts, after viewing the body and hearing the evidence, concluded she came to her death as the result of wounds from a revolver fired by the hand of her husband, Charles Roberts, on this 13th day of August, 1916, in Westville, Digby county."

Roberts is now locked up in the Digby jail awaiting his preliminary examination. Charles Roberts and Kitty Keelan were married in Arrola, Yarmouth county, October 26, 1910, by the Rev. Ben Hill, a Methodist clergyman now stationed in Bermuda. Both Roberts and his wife are natives of Yarmouth county, one of Lower Salmon River, and the other of Hardwicke. At the time of the shooting there was only one woman in the house besides the victim of the tragedy, and that was Kate Frances, wife of Luke Frances. The house is a little distance from the automobile driver not knowing that a murder had been committed.

YOUNG MAN DROWNED

Herb Hoover, a young man, married about six months, was drowned on Friday at Back Bay. He was in a dingy going to Ferry Island near his home. It is supposed he was taken ill and fell from the boat and was drowned.
