

The funeral of Kenneth Williams was held this afternoon from 223 Victoria street. Service was conducted by Rev. J. J. Pinkerton and interment was made


Mary Alice Armstrong The funeral of Mary Alice, infant daughter of Mrs. Hazel Armstrong, was held this afternoon to Holy Cross of
