A COUNTY HEALTH CLINIC

When the county health clinic was established in Nova Scotia, representatives from the municipality of Lunenburg, the three incorporated towns, and Chester, appointed strong committees, which met together and devised a scheme for the permanent establishment of this branch of public health. Mahoue Bay was chosen as the most central moint for the headquarters of the health clinic, a building was rented, furnished and fully equipped, and Miss C. M. Inglis, a nurse of prominent standing, was furnished by the Red Cross Society for the intial year. The equipment, with the exception of a dental department, is complete, and from this centre the nuise goes to all points of the county on a campaign of education, and a visiting of all the schools, examining each pupil, and when any defect of health is noted it is reported to the proper authorities. Already the interest taken in the health clinic is most pronounced, and even for the short time of its starting is filling a great want.


