

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF HURON.

FIRST DAY'S SESSION.

JANUARY 27, 1858.

In pursuance of a circular from the Bishop, the first meeting of the Synod of the Diocese was held in St. Paul's Cathedral, London, C. W., on Wednesday, January 27, 1858, and was legally constituted by the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved,—That we, the Bishop, Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Huron, legally convened, adopt the act of the Provincial Parliament, entitled "An Act to Enable the Members of the United Church of England and Ireland in Canada to meet in Synod."—Carried.

A Committee was appointed to draft a constitution to be submitted at the next meeting of the Synod.

SEPTEMBER 21, 1858.

The next meeting of the Synod was held in St. Paul's Cathedral, London, C. W., on Tuesday, September 21, 1858, there being present Clergy, 24, Lay delegates, 23. An address from the Synod of the Diocese of Toronto on the formation of this diocese, and signed by the Lord Bishop and the Clerical and Lay Secretaries, was read, and a committee, appointed for the purpose, having reported a suitable answer, it was adopted.
