News Summary.

DOMINION.

A Toronto man and his wife were convicted last week of cruelly ill-treating a little daughter of his by his first wife, and were sentenced to one year's imprisonment.

Sir Chas. Tupper arrived in Montreal on Monday.

An ice jam in the river, last week, caused the water to rise rapidly and do serious damage to a number of Ontario's cotton and flour mills, and adjacent dwellings.

The trains on the Albert Railway resumed running between Hillsboro and Harvey this week.

A three-year-old daughter of Capt. Peter McIntyre, of Portland, St. John, was severely burned last Wednesday morning, by setting fire to her clothing while playing with matches, during her mother's absence.

The temperance people of Kings Co. N. S., are indignant that their petition to the Council to appoint an Inspector to prosecute under the Scott Act have not been granted.

Last week, while the mercury in other parts of the Maritime Provinces was trying to how far it could go below zero, the people of Cape Breton were enjoying "mild" weather.

J. R. Bothwell, one of the New York capitalists, who propose building the street railway in St. John, arrived Saturday from Halifax. He says the line will be commenced as soon as possible. Mr. B. has already contracted with Jas. Harris & Co., for the rails. A lot 200 feet front and 150 feet deep will be required for the stables.

One day this week one of the sons of Jarvis Dibblee, Norton, Kings Co., prepared, as he supposed, a table-spoonful of sulphur for an aged but good horse. The medicine proved to be a most efficacious one, from the effects of which the horse succumbed.

FATAL ACCIDENT.—Tuesday night about 11 o'clock a side rail of one of the engines on the I.C.R. accommodation train from Levin to Revere du Loup broke near St. Alexander. Both driver Montgomery and fireman Langlois jumped, but unfortunately Langlois had his neck broken and was otherwise disfigured. He died instantly. Montgomery escaped with broken teeth and other slight contusions.

C. F. Dow, the veteran shipbuilder of Harvey, Albert Co., has been asked by the New York owners, to take charge of the rebuilding and launching of the obstinate big raft at the Loggins, Mr. D., while declining the rebuilding will possibly, say the Observer, try his hand at launching the monster in the spring.

The Canada Gazette contains the appointment of Charles H. Bent of Amherst, N. S., to be agent of the Government Savings Bank at Amherst, vice Dr. Nathan Tupper, deceased.

The output of plaster from Hants co., during 1886 was, says the Tribune, nearly double that of the year previous, as will be seen by the following table, which gives the total quantity exported from 1833 to 1886. For fifty years, from 1833 to 1883 there were exported:

The twenty-third annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Fruit Growers' Association took place in Wolfville last week. The report of the Sec. Treas. showed the finances of the Association to be in a healthy condition, the sum of \$675.00 on hand.

During the past two years S. S. Mayes, the lessee of the p. u. mine near the falls, has had about a dozen men employed there. Mr. Mayes has put in new machinery, which is worked by steam. About 700 tons of the ore can be mined annually, and Mr. Mayes has got out a very large quantity. The ore is shipped generally to the United States, where there is a great demand for it. Sheds have been erected at the mine, in which a large quantity of the ore is stored. Mr. Mayes is prepared to supply the founders of Canada with this ore, which is said to be unequalled in quality.—Sua.

Profit returns of the Canadian Pacific Railway for the last week were \$140,000 against \$170,000 for the same period of last year.

James Bourke has secured the contract for the woodwork of the new Baptist seminary at St. Martins.

Henry Twining, for the third of a century, has been the Nova Scotia house of Assembly in dead, aged seventy years.

The output of coal from Cape Breton last year was the largest on record. Cape Breton county takes the lead of the different counties. The total output is:

Total: 1,430,000, 1,254,000, 176,000. With the exception of Spring Hill, the G. M. A. of North Sydney made the largest shipment of any single mine. The shipment of slack, which a short time since was valued as a yearly increasing, and last year, from Cape Breton county, amounted to about 75,000 tons. The above figures are, as near as possible, correct. At the G. M. A. mine, Cow Bay, 1,500 tons of patent fuel was manufactured.—Sydney Herald.

In a Canadian institution to revolutionize the old methods of Life Insurance? Insurance Society, of Montreal, an able journal devoted exclusively to the interests of regular insurance, says editorially: "The experience of the Dominion Safety Fund Life Association will be so-called with keen interest by all life insurance managers, and if the small deposit it requires be found sufficient, as we think it will be, to hold the members together, then there is no doubt but the system, or its main features at all events, will be generally adopted by all life companies."

Work will commence in a few days on the mammoth mill to be erected at Keswatin Mills on the line of the Cape Breton Railway. The mill will be built of stone and will have a capacity of 1,000 barrels per day. Adjoining the mill will be erected an immense elevator with a capacity of half a million bushels.

The Yarmouth Times of the 22nd says: "Mr. Mayes' manager of the Carleton quicksilver mine, has been successful in getting mine water from the crushing mill at Kemplivie yesterday with a brick of gold weighing 100 ounces, taken from 50 tons of quartz sent up there from the Carleton mine to be crushed. This is the first

clearing up for the mine and they are now taking out some very fine quartz.

It is considered probable that the Dominion Government will set apart a special day upon which Canadians will be requested to observe the Queen's jubilee.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN.

The British steamer "Nepaul" from London, collided with and sank a Chinese transport near Shanghai, on the 22nd. One hundred soldiers and many a man were drowned.

Bumors of war are becoming more and more frequent. The North German Gazette, National Gazette and Ozean-Gazette, as well as the Times, Standard and Daily News, of London, all report the Franco-German frontier strong reinforcements of all kinds of arms.

Large defalcations have been discovered in the Bank of Hong Kong, which has suspended payments. The bank's directors have been arrested. The liability is estimated at 2,750,000 marks. The trouble is reported to be due to the bank supporting unsafe industrial ventures. The depositors are mainly small traders, many of whom are ruined by the bank's suspension.

Her Majesty Stanley started from London on the 21st, for Egypt. He goes first to Brundisi and thence to Suva. A large number of reporters and a few distinguished persons gathered at the railway station to witness his departure. Stanley's last words in reply to an inquiry by a reporter were: "I return as soon as I can. Give my kindest regards to my friends in America, Belgium and England." A train moved out of the station, Stanley was lustily cheered.

The receipts of the French Treasury for 1886 show a decrease of 32,000,000 francs as compared with the receipts of 1885, and a deficiency of 11,000,000 francs as compared with the amount estimated in the budget 1886.

Seventeen persons were trampled to death during a panic in a public hall in London on Wednesday last, by a false alarm of fire during an entertainment. Twelve of the number were women.

The land war in Ireland still rages, and evictions occur very frequently, nearly all being attended with determined resistance by the tenants. Several serious assaults on the officers of the law are reported.

The Right Hon. Sir Michael Morris, Bart., Chief Justice of the Common Pleas, has been appointed Lord Chief Justice of Ireland, vice the Right Hon. Geo. A. O. May, resigned.

Right Hon. Henry Campbell Bannerman, liberal member of parliament, and formerly chief secretary for Ireland, has a speech at Coleraine, near Inverbering, on Saturday, said he believed when home rule was granted to Ireland, Parnell would be the Conservative leader in the Irish parliament, supported by the government and landlords while Parnell's present adjutants would lead the opposition.

Thomas Power O'Connor, speaking at White Haven on Saturday, said Gen. Buller and Mr. Plunket became moonlighters soon after witnessing the condition of the Irish peasants. He denied that Ireland desired separation. "We have," he said, "one crown and one empire. We have also one parliament, and why not say the same? We have one crown and one empire in that we have 33 parliaments."
