PAUL IN ITALY.

NO. 1.

During my visit, in the summer of 1892, to Naples and the historic spots around her far famed waters, I was careful to make note of the places that met the eye of the apostle, as the Alexandrian corn ship—the Caesar and Pallas—carried him and his fellow prisoners under Julius, from Rhegium, in southern Italy, to the lovely bay at Puteoli.

When near the end of his voyage from Caesarea to Rome, in the spring of A. D. 61, after passing through the narrow straits separating the island of Sicily from the mainland, he could not have looked unmoved at the objects before him. He saw the beautiful island of Capri, on which stood the magnificent summer residence of Tiberius, the two great emperors, Augustus and Tiberius. The ruins of these villas are still seen. When I visited this classic island, I stopped at the Hotel Bristol, which stands quite near the site. The palace of Tiberius stood on a peak of the island 700 feet high, from which, it is said, the cruel Emperor compelled his victims to leap into the sea. On the northern side of the bay, Paul saw, on his right, old Herculaneum, where, 18 years after, Pliny the Elder met his sad death at the eruption of Vesuvius. Nearly a dozen miles farther up the bay stood Pompeii, a wealthy city of 30,000 inhabitants, where the younger Pliny and his mother stayed, and where, within the walls of 210 acres, 70 acres of which have thus far been excavated. As I walked over the marble floors of those old palaces, inlaid in the most artistic design, and through the paved, but now silent streets, I could not but feel the distinguished Pliny, as the feet of the distinguished Pliny, as I looked upon the ruins of her gorgeous temples and the thousands of treasures in the museum, I could form some idea of what the city must have been when Paul saw it prior to its overthrow.

A few miles back of these two luxurious cities, lining the shore of the beautiful bay, towered Vesuvius, clothed at that time in its peak with vines and gardens. As Paul remained several days at Puteoli (Acts 28: 14), he must have often gazed at this lofty cone. Prof. Wm. G. Blake, in his "Manual of Bible History," in speaking of Paul's voyage, says the apostle "passed the smoking crater of Vesuvius and the lovely scenery of the Bay of Naples." But Paul entered Rome—according to critical authorities—in March A. D. 61, and Vesuvius did not begin her "erecting" till the 24th of August, 79. The author of Ben Hur, chapter Book III, makes even a greater blunder, as he describes a traveler entering the Bay of Naples in the "smoking cone." It seems strange that such authors should have allowed their pens to slip. But how much more beautiful was Vesuvius then than now. Before her top was blown off, and her homely crater made, she was taller and more symmetrical; and there were none of those immense lava beds at her base. The distance sailed from Rhegium to Puteoli was about 180 miles. Puteoli at this time was Rome's principal port south of Oslia. It was the centre of trade from Spain and Egypt and Syria. An immense wharf—if such it could be called—upheld by twenty-five piers and arches, stretched itself into the harbor, beside which the vessels anchored in discharging their freight and passengers. Thirteen of these stone piers are standing to-day, their tops above the water, which seem almost to tell the traveler that over these Paul walked as he passed from the vessel to the shore.

From Puteoli to Rome is about 140 miles. The first place of importance the apostle touched, 12 miles beyond Puteoli, was Capua. When I was there I could not help contrasting its present with its past. It once had a population of 800,000, now only about 12,000. Hannibal wintered his army there A. C. 216. It was destroyed by the Vandals, A. D. 456. At Capua the companion Way enters the Appian Way. The prisoners here were turned to the left, and had a straight course northward of nearly 180 miles to Rome. The Appian Way is a celebrated road built by Appian Claudius the Censor three centuries before Christ. Its whole length from Rome to Brundisium was about 275 miles; it was substantially paved with large blocks of stone fitted together with great skill, and was sufficiently wide for two carriages to pass. Of all the roads leading into Rome, this was the finest. Pliny and Virgil and Horace speak of the rich vineyards—the vines trained on the elms, in the fertile region through which it runs; and I noticed in many of the fields about Capua grape vines were growing around the trunks of trees of old, and then led from trees to trees by ropes and withes.
