PRODUCE PRICES IN CANADIAN CENTRES

Montreal, Jan. 17.—WHEAT—Ontario wheat—No. 2 winter 86 to 87 cents, outside, according to location.
MANITOBA WHEAT—No. 1 Northern 1.01 to 1.02; No. 2 Northern 1.01 to 1.02; No. 3 Northern 98 cents.
OATS—Canada Western No. 2, 38 to 39 cents; No. 3 Canada Western 37 cents at Lake ports for immediate shipment Ontario No. 2 white 33 to 34 cents outside; No. 3 white on track 35 to 36 cents.
FLOUR—Manitoba flour—first patents \$5.40; second patents \$4.90; strong bakers \$4.70.
ONTARIO FLOUR—Winter flour 90 per cent. patents \$3.60; 80 per cent. patents \$3.50; 70 per cent. patents \$3.40; 60 per cent. patents \$3.30; 50 per cent. patents \$3.20; 40 per cent. patents \$3.10; 30 per cent. patents \$3.00; 20 per cent. patents \$2.90; 10 per cent. patents \$2.80; 0 per cent. patents \$2.70.
MILFEED—Manitoba bran \$20.50 per ton; shorts \$22.50 per ton on track; Ontario bran \$20.50 to \$21; shorts \$22.50 to \$23 per ton on track.
CHEESE—Receipts of cheese 351 boxes against 311 a year ago. The local market is firm under a good inquiry, westerns being quoted at 11 to 12 to 14 cents and easterns at 11 to 14 to 15 cents.
BUTTER—Receipts of butter 206 packages against 261 packages a year ago. The local market is steady with a good inquiry at 25 to 26 cents; No. 1 stock 27 cents; No. 2 stock 25 to 26 cents per dozen.
EGGS—Receipts of eggs were 167 cases. Prices for new laid are easy, as supplies continue to come forward in fair quantities. The demand for all grades is good and the market is fairly active. Strictly new laid 43 cents to 45 cents dozen; selected old stock 32 cents; No. 1 stock 27 cents; No. 2 stock 25 to 26 cents per dozen.
POTATOES—In good demand, especially for small lots. Green Mountain stock were made at 12 to 13 cents and in a jobbing way at 11 to 12 cents.
YARROW—In steady demand for local consumption and prices hold firm. No. 1 choice \$11.50 to \$12; extra No. 2 \$10.50 to \$11; ordinary No. 2 \$9 to \$9.50; clover hay \$7.50 to \$8.
