The soie nead of a family, or any maie over 18 years old, may homesteau a quarter-section of available Dominion and in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or alicerta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-agency for made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditiona. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
