measured westerly along the said
line of the said street
to the western line of a lot of
land at present under lease to one
Anthony A. Pirie, the said point or
place of beginning being also distant
two hundred and thirty six (236) feet
measured westerly along the said
line of Metcalfe Street from the west-
ern line of Durham Street, going
thence southwesterly in a direction at
right angles to Metcalfe Street, said
said, eighty four (84) feet, ten (10)
inches to the rear line of lots front-
ing on Main Street, thence westward-
ly along the said rear line being par-
allel with the said Main Street, thirty
five (35) feet six (6) inches more or
less to a point distant thirty five feet
measured at right angles from the
line last described, thence northward-
ly parallel with the said line and in
a direction at right angles to Met-
calfe Street aforesaid eighty (80)
feet more or less to the said street
